OUR PURPOSE




WHAT IS EARLY ACCESS?

Early Access is an optional educational program to include "highly gifted" underage learners in educational programs for kindergarten and first grade who are:

- Academically ready
- Emotionally ready
- Behaviorally ready

CDE GUIDELINES FOR EARLY ACCESS

The following pathway meets criteria for early access identification.

WHAT ARE THE STATE CRITERIA?

A child admitted under the Colorado Early Access provision must demonstrate high:

- + Aptitude at or above the 97th percentile
- + Achievement at or above the 97th percentile
- + Performance at or above the 97th percentile
- + Readiness for advanced placement
- + Observable advanced social behavior
- + Motivation to learn
- + Support from parents

Guidelines for Enrolling or Counting Early Access Students

Student Types

In addition to the documentation necessary defined researching that students meet the enrollment, attendance, and scheduling criteria needed for funding additional documentation may be required, depending on the classification of a student or program in which the student is participating. Following are provisions for the "Advanced Highly Gifted Students", a type commentation. Floras enter that the easific documentation category that requires additional documentation. Please note that the easific documentation is fixed for off "Student Types" is in addition to all other required documentation (e.g., enrollment dates,): Ender commentation.

Advanced Highly Gifted Students

Pursuant to CSL 22-20-204(2) administrative units may permit early access to kindergarten to a highly gifted advanced four year old and early access to first grade to a highly gifted advanced five year old.

- The administrative unit at the school district, board of cooperative services or the state
 Charter School Institute must file a written early access addendum to the AU's Comprehensive Program Plan.
- The initial AU addendum must be filed for approval with the Gifted Education Unit at the Department of Education by January 1 prior to the fiscal year of implementation. (For example: Eligible addendums for fiscal year 2016-2017 must be submitted by January 2016).
- The early access addendum template and checklist are located on CDE's Web page: http://cde.state.co.us/gt/resources.htm
- The early access student for grades K and 1st must have an ALP on file by <u>September 30</u> of each year to be verified and counted in the October enrollment.
- For a four year old to be counted as a kindengartener or a five year old to be counted as a first grader the ALP must show the notation "grade acceleration" on the first or cover page of the ALP.
 This notation must be visible for both the kindengarten and grade one school years, as applicable to the early screen studies.
- The student must reach the age of four by October 1 for kindergarten.
 The student must reach the age of five by October 1 for grade one.

- The early access provisions benefit only a few highly advanced gifted children.
 The legislation is not for the majority of age 4 or age 5 gifted students who are served in preschool and kindergrature programs. Gifted elecution directors and coordinators between the with their superintendent if early access will be permitted in the administrative unit and an early access addendunged on the coordinators.

Interest/Inquiry

If a parent/guardian determines that his/her preschool or kindergarten child may be highly gifted and would like to inquire about early access/entrance to kindergarten or first grade, the parent/guardian may contact a Jeffco preschool, elementary school, district Early Childhood Education office or district Gifted and Talented office. Upon request, an informational brochure will be made available.

Inquiries/requests will be processed by Jeffco Public Schools' Child Find department using the Intake Form. The Child Find department will mail a Developmental History form to the parent/guardian and forward the Intake Form to the director of Gifted and Talented or designee.

 - + A letter from the parent(s) of the child requesting Early Access
 - + Complete online the Parent Information Form
 - + Complete online the <u>School Information Form</u> (GT office will send the Gifted Rating Scale to be completed by an education profession indicated on this form)
 - + 4-6 carefully selected items in a Portfolio format as outlined in the <u>Kingore Portfolio Assessment Guidelines</u> document.
 - × Please fill out an artifact (1/3 sheet) description form for each

selected item.

- + Complete online My Child's Strengths
 - × English | Spanish

The Early Access Packet /Portfolio is due on March 24, 2017 to The Director of Gifted and Talented at the Jefferson County Education Center in order to be scheduled for cognitive testing. No exceptions.





Early Access



To meet the needs of highly advanced children who have not yet entered kindergarten or first grade, Jeffco Public Schools may grant early entrance to school.

This process is not for typical children who miss the October 1 Kindergarten entrance date. Jeffco Board of Education Policy - IHBB-R.

Early Access into kindergarten or first grade was established by House Bill 1021, effective July 2008.

- The student must reach the age of four by October 1 for kindergarten.
- The student must reach the age of five by October 1 for grade one.

Fast Facts for Early Access

Who will benefit from HB 1021? The HB 1021 defines that 4 or 5 year old child who is "highly advanced gifted child." The child is academically gifted, socially and emotionally mature and in the top 2 percent or less of the gifted population.

Application Process

- Apply Opens in January (January 3, 2017 April 1, 2017)
- Receive Early Access / Developmental History Form Packet from GT Office – Generated from application
- Early Access Packet / Portfolio (Due by March 24, 2017)
- Early Access Team will contact parents with completed and qualifying portfolio to schedule Cognitive Testing.
- The Early Access Cognitive Testing cost \$250 (waived for families who have qualified for the free/reduced lunch program)
- Cognitive Testing will be scheduled.
